Dear Nobles and Ladies,

RECORDER'S CORNER



December 15, 2016 Stated Meeting is Karem's annual election of Officers for the ensuing Shrine year, and that being for 2017. I wanted to clarify the, sometime overwhelming, responsibility your Board of Directors are facing when they assume their respective positions that you have elected them to perform as your representative.

WHAT IS A POTENTATE? Webster defines a potentate as one who has power—a monarch. And so it is in the Shrine, the Potentate is vested with all-authority and power. He can, by the wave of his hand, veto or approve any and all activities of his Temple, so far as they do not conflict with, or are contrary to Law, which he has sworn ever to maintain, support and conform to.

How does one attain this powerful and honorable position? The usual procedure is to come up through the line starting as Oriental Guide, and if by the Grace of God and the charity of the Nobility, he is elected each year and elevated each year, he becomes Potentate in five years—the highest and most honorable position to which it is possible for the Nobility to elect anyone. The Nobility of the Temple honored this Noble by electing him to this high place.

The Chief Rabban, Assistant Rabban, High Priest and Prophet, Oriental Guide, Treasurer and Recorder are also elected each year by the Nobility and they each have their respective duties to perform. They are not hired or appointed by the Potentate; therefore, are not working for him but should work with him, and with them, to the best interests of the Temple.

A Shrine Temple has jurisdiction over a large area, or population, and is therefore of a regional nature, rather than a local one. It is not only a fraternal organization, but one that contributes substantially to the welfare of the community over which it has jurisdiction.

Through our Hospitals, the Shrine is making a never ending contribution to humanity.

During the years that a Noble serves in an elective position on the Divan, he should give of his time and efforts and acquaint himself with the workings of the Shrine; and when he is elected Potentate, he should make his Temple's business the major objective for that year. This is his reasonable service and responsibility—in fact, the oath of office he took before being installed covers this. In other words, he should not take a major part in other organizations of a civic, charitable or social nature, which would interfere in any way with his duties as Potentate, since the Temple can well use every spare moment he can possibly give from his business, vocation or profession; and since the Shrine Temple includes civic, charitable and social activities, it affords ample employment of any Potentate's time. As in any other business or organization, the Temple grows, prospers and takes its rightful place at the top, in the community, in proportion to the administration of the Potentate.

OFFICIAL CALL OF THE POTENTATE
STATED SESSION AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS
THURSDAY, DECEMBER 15, 2016, WACO

NOBLES: A stated business session of Karem Shrine International, is hereby called for Thursday, December 15, at 7:00pm at the Karem Shriners Center, 400 Karem Circle, Waco, Tx. The Purpose of the meeting is to hold an election of Officers for the ensuing year, and such other business as may come before it.

NOTE: ARTICLE XXV, SECTION 325.4 "Each Temple must elect its officers and representatives, at its annual meeting in January unless its bylaws allow the election to occur at the temple's stated meeting in December."

ARTICLE XXV, SECTION 325.6 "Nominations must commence not later than 9:00pm and when that hour arrives all other business must cease and none may be transacted until the election is concluded."

ARTICLE XXV, SECTION 325.11 OF THE IMPERIAL CODE: (a) "A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited. (c) For any violation, the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election."

"The Recorder of Temples shall mail a notice of the annual session and election to all members of the Temple at least one week prior to the date of said election, and said notice shall contain this section."

The Imperial Law requires that you have your 2016 dues card to attend this meeting. This notification in the Karavan serves as the Recorder's notification to all Karem members.

BYLAWS (IO WA)

BYLAWS (IO WA)

325.1 Officers.

(a) **List.** The officers of a temple are:

- (1) Potentate..... Shayk
- (2) Chief Rabban..... Emeer
- (3) Assistant Rabban..... Sahib
- (4) High Priest and Prophet..... Imam
- (5) Oriental Guide..... Ayn
- (6) Treasurer..... Chayzin
- (7) Recorder..... Katib
- (8) First Ceremonial Master..... Wakil
- (9) Second Ceremonial Master..... Alam
- (10) Director..... Malah
- (11) Marshal..... Amal
- (12) Captain of the Guard..... Rays
- (13) Outer Guard..... Hafiz

(b) **Limitation.** No person may hold more than one of the foregoing offices at the same time

Amend. 1983

325.2 Election and Qualification.

(a) **Election Order.** The first 7 officers shall be elected annually, in the order in which they appear in 325.1(a), by ballot and constitute the official divan. Candidates for elective office in a temple must be members in good standing of that temple.

Amend. 1988, 1983

(b) **Term Limit.** A Noble may not serve as Potentate of any Temple for more than 2 years.

© **Qualification.** A Noble may not serve as Potentate of any temple unless he shall have first served at least one term as either Chief Rabban or Assistant Rabban of a temple

(d) **Dispensation.** Upon a showing of good and sufficient cause, in writing and at least 60 days prior to the temple election, the Imperial Potentate may waive the provisions of subsection © with respect to candidates for the office of Potentate at such temple election.

Amend. 1981

325.3 Appointment. The other officers named in 325.1 shall be appointed by the Potentate

325.4 When Elected. Each temple must elect its officers and

representatives at its annual meeting in January unless its bylaws allow the election to occur at the temple's stated meeting in December.

Amend. 1987

325.5 Ballot.

(a) **Separate Ballot.** Election of officers shall be by a majority vote of those present and voting. When there is more than one candidate for election to a particular office, a separate written ballot is required. A blanket ballot is prohibited.

Amend. 2012

(b) **Retention.** The ballots cast in any contested election for temple office shall be retained in the custody of the Recorder for a period of 90 days following the election, after which they may be destroyed unless the Imperial Potentate otherwise orders.

Amend. 1978

© **Void Ballot.** Blank ballots or ballots containing any markings other than the name of a candidate nominated from the floor are not votes and are not to be considered for any purpose.

Add. 2006

325.6 Time of Election. Nominations must commence not later than 9:00 p.m. and when that hour arrives all other business must cease and none may be transacted until the election is concluded.

Amend. 1972

325.7 Other Officers. The temple may elect such other officers as its bylaws provide.

325.8 Nomination. Candidates for office and Representative must be placed in nomination from the floor.

Amend. 1993

325.9 Leadership Search Committee. The Board of Directors may appoint a committee consisting of not more than five (5) Nobles to study the qualifications of possible candidates for elective office in the temple. This committee may report their findings to the Board of Directors and/or to the temple members in the form of a nomination at a temple election. This committee may also consult with the Chief Rabban on his appointments if so requested.

Add. 2003

325.10 Representatives.

(a) **Single Ballot.** Where a temple elects more than one Representative, all candidates must be balloted for on one written ballot.

(b) **Complete Ballot.** Each member voting must vote only for the total number of Representatives to be elected, otherwise his ballot cannot be counted as a vote

© **Majority Vote.** A majority vote of those present and voting is necessary to elect each Representative

(d) **Election.** Only those candidates who receive a majority vote shall be declared elected.

(e) **Successive Ballots.** Successive written ballots must then be taken in the same manner on other candidates until all Representatives are elected.

(f) **Highest Vote.** If more candidates receive a majority vote than the number of representatives to be elected, then those receiving the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected.

(g) **Void Ballot.** Blank ballots or ballots containing any markings other than the name of a candidate nominated from the floor are not votes and are not to be considered for any purpose.

Amend. 2006

325.11 Election Regulations.

(a) **Electioneering.** A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.

(b) **Expenditures Prohibited.** The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.

© **Violation.** For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

(d) **Notice.** At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

ORIENTAL GUIDE MUST BE SELECTED WISELY.....

When members of a Shrine Center elect a Noble to the office of Oriental Guide, they are virtually starting the Noble through the Divan on the assumption he will prove qualified for, and worthy of, advancement to the high office of Illustrious Potentate. Hence, it is quite evident that the nomination for Oriental Guide should be based upon thorough and accurate evaluation of character, ability, prestige, interest and experience.

A Noble can be a good fellow, a hard worker and a loyal Shriner...and yet lack the basic qualifications which make a good Potentate. Unless a Noble is fully qualified for the job, he is unfair both to himself, and to his Temple, in seeking the office, or in permitting his fellow Nobles to support and promote his candidacy.

Each Shrine Temple needs and requires able high-type leadership. The normal starting out point of that leadership is the office of Oriental Guide. The following checklist may prove helpful in evaluation of potential candidates for the office of Oriental Guide. However, no thinking man would be so naive or presumptuous as to believe that any one Noble could possibly embody all the virtues, talents and qualifications that are set forth in the checklist. Nevertheless, the list has practical value, for self-evaluation by the Nobles whose ultimate aspiration is the office of Illustrious Potentate...and for advance evaluation of candidates by the voting members.

1. He should have good business judgment.
2. He should be friendly and outgoing, a good mixer.
3. He should have the ability to express himself clearly in language that will make us proud of him, rather than apologetic.
4. He should present an imposing personal appearance.
5. He should be able to hold his own and advance the interest of his Temple and Freemasonry in high places as well as among the humble.
6. He should be a devoted Mason and constantly promote the interest of Freemasonry everywhere.
7. He should be proud, yet humble.
8. He should have good Character and a past open to investigation.
9. He should be a leader, have good standing in the community and be influential in its affairs.
10. He should be financially secure.
11. He should be in good health, full of energy and vitality.
12. He should be able to devote ample time to his duties.
13. He should be a man who, when he appears anywhere in public, will make you proud of him and not apologetic for his shortcomings.
14. His wife should be able to understand his devotion to duty; realize that he is Potentate and not she; be able to dress and wear appropriate clothing and be familiar with the social amenities. Remember, she is destined to become Karem's First Lady. Nominations for Oriental Guide should be based upon thorough and accurate evaluation of character, ability and interest. Remember, you are electing your spokesman and standard bearer and the one who will represent you throughout the World. We have a great storehouse of talent in our Temple. Let's seek it! Let's be fair and sincere. Let's get the very best we can.

HE BROUGHT MEMORIES FROM THE PAST:

NOBLE ROBERT STONE

1921-2014

This article started out as a tribute to Brother Stone, but you see, Robert was a memory maker. Tho he fought in three (3) wars, his military service began in World War II and that's where these memories began. On Sunday morning, December 7, 1941, the day after the close of the Annual Communication of the M.W. Grand Lodge of Texas, the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor. From that moment on, war activities began in Waco Masonic Circles. In 1942, Waco had two Army Flying Schools and an enormous Ordinance Plant, plus a number of clothing contracts for army cots, bedding, tents and clothing.

Names of Masons and Shriners 'Out of District' were secured, and at many Shrine Stated Meetings, more than 100 sojourning brðhren were in attendance. During the long hot summer of 1942, programs and refreshments were served at every Stated Meeting, and the Game Room (down at the old Temple) was always open to provide fellowship to service personnel.

Requests to confer Masonic Degrees and Shrine Ceremonials, by 'Courtesy,' were constantly coming in. We had 'Rush Degrees and Ceremonials' most every month, for so often these men were being transferred to another post, or sent overseas.

Recreation Rooms were built at these flying schools, furnished with games, tables, writing and reading tables, chairs, lounges and radios, by Masons and Shriners in Waco. I have a picture of Noble Clyde Turner and Noble Lee Lockwood standing in front of a Recreation Hall at one of the flying schools that was built and equipped by members of Karem Shrine.

Karem Temple, at the beginning of 1942, arranged for Shriners to bring any Master Mason in military uniform to the Shrine Club rooms, and for other entertainments. At one Shrine Party, over 250 Masons and Shriners from the Flying Schools were in attendance.

Karem Temple also arranged for the U.S.O. to use one of our ground floor rooms, down at the old Temple at 7th and Washington, as a complete Soldier's Club, open from 9:00am to midnight, seven days a week. On Friday nights, a dance was held by the Shrine. All military personnel were invited. Graduation Ceremonies from the flying schools were held in our Ballroom, not at the fields.

So you see, Robert, you have once again been a memory maker. So each time we think of you, we will remember the sacrifices you made during the war that permitted us, as Masons and Shriners to be safe and able to serve the military, Masons and Shriners, in a time of war. It was an honor for me to sit next to you at each of our Stated Meetings these past years. I don't know what the General meant when he said, "Old Soldiers never die, they just fade away"..... I would change that to say, "Old Soldiers never die, they just bring back, and leave, beautiful memories."
